Measuring the impact of PPG spending

Impact will be measured throughout the year and after specific interventions. Pupil progress is monitored regularly.

66% of children entered for the level 6 maths achieved this level with the support provided in the maths enrichment programme.

66.6% of pupil premium children achieved level 4 in maths due to the enrichment programme.

100% of parents felt the Aspirations Programme raised their children's confidence and inspired them to think about their futures in a positive way.

The children working with the play therapist have benefitted from small group work and will continue to aid in their transition into their next year group. Families also benefitted from the 1:1 sessions we were able to fund.

On average our pupils working with the aid of our PP LSA made more than 3 APS (average point score) progress. This provision allowed the LSA or the class teacher to work closely with these pupils to ensure their barriers to learning were addressed and academic or social and emotional support provided with a personalised approach.

76.6% of Year 1 pupils achieved the pass mark for the phonics screening due to the small group phonic phased groups and extra support through the PP LSA provision.

All families of PP children attended at least one of the 'Stay and Play' or 'Pick up and Play' sessions offered by Year R and Year 1 creating a learning bond between child and parent through the use of specially chosen educational games.
