It has been a cracking half term of sporting opportunities for so many of our children and we would like to start our newsletter with a round up of all the events we have participated in over the last few weeks. Last week (Friday 8th March), Fishbourne School netball team went to Bishop Luffa to take part in a tournament against eleven other teams. There were two teams representing Fishbourne and both were very successful. Everyone played exceptionally well despite the weather conditions and soldiered through injuries. They worked collaboratively together and were determined to get through to the next round. Laura Maddicks (coach), and the parents who came along were very supportive towards their teams. In this event, the children had to be collaborative and positive as they had to work together and not get upset if they lost!

On the 13th March, the Fishbourne Running team completed the second round of the Corporate Challenge. All the runners finished with amazing times, even with the falls, bruises and lost shoes! Surprisingly, all the Year 6 runners achieved a time of under 6 minutes. Ollie in Year 6 reported that at the start of the race he was filled with fear, adrenalin and pride. 'This race is challenging and full of fear for me but very supportive!' Magnus recounted to the rest of the team.

On the 13th Mach, four keen pupils left for a swimming gala. The gala was held in Horsham Swimming Complex. The team did really well in their races and came third in the medley relay. Unfortunately they were one place out of the top three in the freestyle relay. We finished well and everyone was happy with the outcome.

Six children from year groups 5 and 6 were selected to take part in a West Sussex sports programme called Future Flyers. This programme is for gifted and sporty children; they have been chosen to boost their athleticism. There are many sporting activities for everyone to enjoy including: boxing, dry swimming, running, cycling, football, hockey and netball. At the end of the experience, the children will receive a certificate for taking part.



What an amazing night for Fishbourne School on Saturday. For the first time we were invited to take part in the Cormorants Chichester Schools Gala. There was incredible talent from all 6 schools taking part, but Fishbourne absolutely sparkled! It was nail biting! Courage, determination, collaboration and positivity poured into the pool as many of our children had never taken part in a gala before.



We have also been thrilled to continue our collaboration with Theatre Inc. and performed at The Alexandra Theatre on Monday evening as part of Dance House. This partnership started three years ago and has proved so successful and valuable that we have continued to work closely together. School development plan:

You may remember from our first newsletter of 2019 that this term we are focusing on developing our maths provision throughout school. During this time we have worked to develop our approach to base-lining children's understanding at the beginning of a sequence of teaching and learning; using intelligent practice (meaning that the careful and mindful build up of challenge) and the introduction of BIG questions. We have been experimenting with Big Questions in the classroom and have spent time reflecting on this new element of our practice through Lesson Study. This involves staff filming their input to the session and resulting learning before reviewing it with a colleague. We have seen some exciting results from these big questions and will continue to develop these as we move into the summer term. This approach will be used at key points during a sequence of teaching and learning and will compliment other approaches in the classroom; it is giving all children the opportunity to take their learning further and think more deeply, it provides all children with exactly the same starting point and removes any ceilings from learning. During a learning walk this week, we saw some super examples of children learning in this way.

Following a very successful pilot with children in Year 6 and 4, we have now launched Times Table Rock Stars (TTRS) with all children in year groups 2—6 and you will have received details about how to log on to this at home. The children have been highly engaged with the programme that aims to increase fluency and speed with times tables and related division facts. We know that children who have this confident knowledge base always make better progress in maths and so this investment of time and effort is really key to growing confident mathematicians.



Mid-year reports came home on Friday and we hope you agree that they gave a super insight into your child's learning and progress. The children and staff have spent a huge amount of time preparing these very personalised reflections and we do hope you will read them carefully with your child and find them

helpful. In addition to the written reports, we have sent home information separately as to whether we feel your child is on track to meet the end of year expectations. We would just like to remind you that in order to 'meet' end of year expectations, the children need to have met every single one of the criteria, these are available for you to read for each year group on our school website. If you have any questions or queries about these reports, please don't hesitate to pop in and have a chat with your child's class teacher or me! PLEASE do take the time to fill in the report feedback slips and return them to the school office. We really value your feedback and the children value hearing your voice in response to their hard work! A huge thank you to all the staff and children involved in the report writing process for the deep thinking and careful reflections about the children's progress.

We are extremely excited to be trialling a 'whole class text' in each class after Easter. This was an approach we piloted with Meerkats class last summer using Skychasers by Emma Carroll and was hugely successful for all children in the class! It was magical to each have a copy of the book and enjoy devouring it together! Thanks to the generosity of FOFS and Humberts, each child will receive their own copy of the text which they will be able to keep. This allows us wonderful flexibility in the choice of texts, meaning we will never fall into the trap of having to read certain books with certain year groups; instead we will always be able to personalise our book choice to meet the needs of a given cohort, taking into account their interests and



author preferences. This is an important part of our approach to learning! We will be using these texts during the summer term to inspire our reading. Look out for more information coming out soon! Children in Year 6 launched their text last Friday afternoon with a visit from Jaws and Claws to HOOK them into their learning. What an afternoon! Their text, Beetle Boy by MG Leonard was launched and the children have begun devouring the story. Look out for information about other whole class texts during the summer term! We look forward to sharing with you our learning and the children's responses to it!

A huge thank you to everyone for your support with our fundraising efforts this term. We were delighted to bank a healthy £206.14 for Comic Relief last Friday and welcomed your positive feedback about our approach to red noses! The children had a super day although it felt very strange seeing a sea of red clothing throughout school!
