


programme in school with children from Year 1 - Year 6 to support the children's understanding about how they can stay safe both in and out of school. They have learned the NSPCC telephone number:

We love books very much at Fishbourne CE Primary and our library brings a great deal of joy to us all. Mrs Whittaker does a wonderful job of keeping an ever-changing collection of books on display to inspire the children and to make them aware of the incredible books they can choose from.



When the children come back to school following the Christmas holiday, they will be taking part in our next whole school learning experience, QUEST. Quest is the second in a trilogy of wordless picture books created by Aaron Becker. Our children will be immersed in Aaron's work and become story breathers! We are super-excited about returning to the adventures of the two friends and their magical markers that will inspire our young authors. As adults in school, we will be focusing in

particularly on how we assess children's progress between baseline and end goal and how we plan for the personalised steps of learning. This is one of our priorities on our school development plan as we recognise how important it is that we both continue to teach the writing curriculum to our children while also ensuring that we meet the children at their personal starting points. Staff have spent time together looking at samples of the children's writing, identifying what the children's next steps are and reflecting on ways that they can ensure that the children get the personalised support they need during a sequence of teaching and learning. We look forward very much to sharing the outcomes of this learning experience with you so that you can see the progress that your children are making. As usual, your child's learning journal will come home at the end of this experience for you to share the journey with them!



We LOVE reading and deliver reading lessons through whole class texts which are chosen especially with the unique cohort in mind. As a result, each year we hunt for a local company

New Years Resolutions

As we move to the start of a new year, we would love you to commit to some new years resolutions to support your child's learning. 1) Support your children to increase their fluency and automaticity with recalling number facts. Those children in Y2 and above will be learning their times tables and these are such essential foundations for the children

to have in place as they move through the mathematics curriculum. 2)READ with your children (and to your children!) every day—make it a part of your routine. It makes a HUGE difference to confidence and enjoyment. 3) Arrive in school ON TIME! The gates at school open at 8.45am. The children are greeted by their class teacher and start a morning activity. At 8.55am the bell is rung at which point the gates to the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds are locked. All children should be in school by 8.55am at the latest.

Our Behaviour for Learning and Life policy is now up on our school website so please do have a look! Our three key 'rules' are: Ready? Respectful? Safe? We have spent this half term exploring what each of these words means to our school family during our assembly times. Lots of families have told us that they are using these 'rules' at home now too to support their children and this has really helped them! Wonderful!



As we break up for the Christmas holidays, it seems apt to remind ourselves of the role we all play in making the world a better place to be through Nelson Mandella's words: 'We can change the world and make it a better place.
