

FISHBOURNE CHURCH OF ENGLAND PRIMARY SCHOOL







Welcome back to a brand new half term at Fishbourne Church of England Primary School. As you will know, we spent time just before half term reflecting on ourselves as learners and carried out standardised tests in year groups 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6. These provide a helpful opportunity for staff to reflect on whole class priorities and individual children's personalised steps of learning. Reports will be ready to come home just before the Easter holidays and will contain information about your child's next steps of learning.



In response to the parent survey, some families said they felt out of touch with where their children were as learners. We will be holding an **open classroom** in the coming weeks where you can come and see your children's books and listen to a short presentation by your class teacher about the learning happening in the classroom and ways in which you can support with this at home.

These will take place at 2.45pm on: Wednesday 9th March for families in Y1 Thursday 10th March for families in EYFS, Y2 and 5 Monday 14th March for families in Y3, 4 and 6

In the meantime, the two very best ways you can support your children at home are by reading together EVERY SINGLE DAY and practising number bonds and times tables EVERY SINGLE DAY. The difference this will make to your child in terms of their confidence, their fluency and their ability to take on new learning is immeasurable! We see evidence of this in our classrooms every single day. Ten minutes of each really does make all the difference in the world.



Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment every day develop a broader vocabulary, increased general knowledge and a better understanding of other cultures. In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background. You can make a huge difference! Parents are the most important educators in a child's life – even

more important than their teachers! Being read to and being listened to will have a huge impact on your child's fluency and confidence.

In the autumn term, Mrs Buchan and Year 6 made a film to explain why knowing your times tables is such an important part of developing as a confident mathematician and the significance it has as children continue their journey of learning. If you haven't seen this film yet,

Elephant Class (Y3) will be continuing their learning about ancient history, this time focusing on the Stone Age. Their hook into learning will be the incredible adventure story, Stone Age Boy. The end goal will be to write to persuade guests to stay at the stone age settlement, Skara Brae.






Crocodile Class (Y1) will also be doing a history based learning experience, focused on our local area. As part of their hook, Crocodiles are going to travel back in time to look at familiar places in Fishbourne to find out if there were ever any shops in the village. After carrying out their own historical research the children will

reflect on our Enquiry Question and be able to answer it with reasons why, highlighting changes that have occurred in shopping in Fishbourne over time.

In Cheetah class, learning centres around a beautiful picture book 'Once There Were Giants', by Martin Waddell. As a hook in to the children's learning, they will be welcoming a member of the classes new baby brother in and learn all about looking after a new baby! We will also be playing 'guess the baby', with a display of photographs of Cheetah Class as babies (there may be some grown-up Cheetahs too)! During this learning, we will be thinking about and ordering different stages of human






Children in Koalas (Y5) class will be taking part in a science based learning experience, Living Things and their habitats. This will include describing the different life cycles of mammals, amphibian, insects and birds including the reproduction cycle of plants and animals. Our Koalas will be hooked into their learning with a trip to Arundel Wetland Centre to explore life cycles of different species. By the end of the learning

experience they will be able to write a non-chronological report about the life cycles of mammals, amphibian, insects and birds in which they can showcase their knowledge and understanding.

Our lucky Hippo (Y2) class are also being hooked into their geography learning experience, Coast, with a visit to East Head being hosted by the Harbour Conservancy where they will learn more about coastlines and some of the challenges that human beings bring with them when they visit the beach! We have our fingers crossed for



a lovely, sunny day for them! They will be using their new knowledge and skills to persuade visitors how important it is to look after our coastline.



Penguins are learning about the Anglo Saxons. They will be exploring this creatively through the text of Beowulf and historically, by learning about Who the Anglo Saxons were and why they invaded and settled in Britain. Our end goal first part, is to write a creative piece about Beowulf's battle. We then have a textiles week linked also to the Anglo Saxons where for our end goal we will be creating an Anglo-Saxon purse and writing a leaflet about the Anglo-Saxons in Britain, following a visit from Paul Ullson and hopefully a trip to Butser!

Panthers learning experience is 'We are Global Citizens!' Through this, the children will be exploring what globalisation is and what it means to be a Global Citizen. They will look at trade around the world and how we can make a difference to other people and our planet by making choices when we shop.



Their end goal will be a persuasive text focussing on fair trade and climate considerations - 'Choose the world you want'.

The outbreak of war in Ukraine has featured in a lot of our thoughts over the half term break and it has been interesting to hear the children talking about their feelings and reflections during the week. We have talked with the children about ways in which we can make the world a better place for refugees arriving in England and those overseas with an emphasis on being proactive and responding positively to a situation over which we have no control and praying for those who do.
