By the time the idea was shared with the children at school, it was welcomed with enthusiasm and we were well on the way to making it happen! You see, each of the doves hanging from the ceiling holds within it a prayer or hope for peace. There is a dove here from every child, every member of staff, every governor. They reflect the shared hope we have for peace in the world. Last year, we built a connection with Sanctuary Chichester through a fundraising project. The children at Fishbourne, through their Thinking Circles, decided they wanted the money raised to be used to buy a copy of our school book, Only One You, for each child arriving in Chichester, seeking refuge. We are really grateful to everyone for their generous donations and will look forward to sharing with you the total raised at the beginning of the spring term.

Our Community Tea Party is a much loved annual event at Fishbourne Primary and this is when our youngest fish invite, organise and host a tea party for members of the local community. They invite neighbours, Fishbourne Companions, our Volunteer Army and many more guests. This year was particularly



special as we welcomed a dozen or so representatives from Sanctuary Chichester including trustees, staff and beneficiaries. Our children in Key Stage 1 sang their hearts out and children in Year 6 sat and chatted with our guests, all under the Flight of Doves.



As you will know from previous correspondence, we have academy order and so last representatives from the Department for Education,

We will, of course, keep families up to date with the process and let you know any updates. We have already started meeting on a fortnightly basis with the team at the BLLP and will be meeting the primary heads on a fortnightly basis too. We are very excited to be part of the partnership at this formative stage and look forward to working alongside the teams at Bishop Luffa, Rumboldswhyke and Lavant in the months and years to come.

The week after February Half Term we will be having our second whole school learning experience of the year - Happy from Head to Toe. It is a PSHCE learning experience in which we will be exploring physical and mental wellbeing. By the end of the week, we will each be pledging ways in which we can look after our own wellbeing and find our happy. During the week, we have lots of wonderful opportunities planned and ways for the children to learn the art and importance of self-care. In order to do this, we will be giving the children opportunities to try out different ways of taking care of their

wellbeing. If you have a particular skill or gift you could share with our children (and have a DBS certificate), please do get in touch and let us know—this might include: sewing, a sport, crafting, singing, baking, a hobby... any number of things that could support our children to learn the impact that self-care has on us. We will be running workshops with mixed age groups on:

Another plug for this brilliant, highlyrecommended book...

Our school 'Behaviour for Learning and Life' policy is heavily influenced by the work of Paul Dix and his book 'When the adults change, everything changes'. In September, his latest book was published which takes many of the strategies we use at school and applies them to home settings. We have several copies of this book in our Wellbeing Library and highly recommend it as a starting point to reflect on patterns of behaviour at home: 'Your behaviour is the only behaviour over which you have absolute control. To change your children's

behaviour, you first need to change your own. The culture of any home is determined by the parents. If you can remain unflappably calm in the face of every supermarket tantrum and sarcastic eye-roll, order will soon follow. Here, Paul Dix - Britain's leading children's behaviour expert - reveals how to build a culture of calm consistency into your home, starting today. He explains how you really can maintain a sense of Zen-like serenity in the face of even the most chaotic behaviour, from school-gate screaming matches to mealtime childmageddon. And he offers a set of simple strategies for coolly getting the behaviour you want - without a barked instruction, deranged punishment or cold, hard cash-bribe in sight. His tried-andtested method will change what your child does by first changing what you do!
