Welcome to the summer term and your child's final term at Fishbourne Primary School! Our eldest fish have a busy few weeks ahead and this letter is intended to ensure that you are fully informed of all that we are up to. ## **Trashsion Show**

To celebrate our spring term learning on Globalisation and Fast Fashion, the children will be presenting a Trashsion Show on **Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April at 9:15am**. They will be reading parts of their powerful speeches written last term and ensuring their voices are heard, making the world a better place to be.

## **Heart to Heart**

We will start the summer term with this science based learning experience. We will gain knowledge to answer our big question: How do an animal's living systems work together to maintain a healthy body? Our learning will start with a hook into learning provided by Chichester College at their science laboratory. Our learning will provide opportunities for scientific enquiry and for carrying out planned experiments. Our end goal will be to create an explanation text focused on the circulation system.

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## National Curriculum KS2 Tests

Revision for the Statutory Attainment Tests, administered in May, will start this week. These tests give a measure of your child's attainment at the end of their Primary Education and reflect their knowledge and skills gained in KS2. They provide important information to secondary schools about how best to support your child on the next phase of their education into KS3. The tests cover all learning throughout KS2 and so much of our revision will focus on concepts taught in Years 3, 4 and 5.

Your child's homework will consolidate their understanding. **Please do support your child with these tasks. It is also vital to keep up with times tables quizzing and to read daily.**

### **A horror writing focus**

The Penguin's love horror writing and so we will be using the animation 'Francis' to inspire writing a prequel. Written by novelist & screenwriter Dave Eggar, for the ever-popular radio show This American Life, animated film Francis is the tense tale of the unexplained happenings on a lake in the middle of an Ontario nature reserve. This will be an opportunity for the children to independently showcase all of their KS2 writing skills and for this piece of writing to join the collection of work your child has created this year.

### **Charlie and the Chocolate Factory**

After half term, rehearsals will increase as we prepare for our end of year summer production! Please support your child in learning their lines so that they shine with confidence and pride. Further details will follow about individual rehearsals, which will be planned for before and after school.

### **Habitats**

This will be our final learning experience of the school year and will give us opportunities to get outside and enjoy the warmer weather. Our learning will focus on recognising that living things can be grouped in a variety of different ways, exploring and using classification. We will learn to recognise that environments can change and that this can sometimes pose dangers to living things. We will be planning an offsite visit to Arundel Wetlands Trust. Further details to follow.

### **Design Technology**

Our end goal will be to design and make a product to sell at the school fete this year. We will be using our skills of combining different fabric shapes to make 'bags for life'. Be sure to buy yours on the day!

### **PSHCE**

What are drugs and how do they impact on our health? In this learning experience we will learn that all medicines are drugs, but not all drugs are medicines. We will discuss vocabulary they may have heard and we discuss peer pressure. ## **Maths and English**

Once we have completed our End of KS2 tests, our focus will be to ensure your child is ready for KS3. Bridging units help children to see the natural links between primary and secondary curriculum and to understand that secondary education is about progression, not starting something completely new. My aim is to ensure a smooth progression in your child's learning.

## **Year 7 Transition**

I have started to meet with secondary schools to discuss your child's transition to their next school. You will also receive information from your new school inviting your child to attend key transition events. Please do let me know if you have any questions or concerns about transition arrangements so I can support you.

## **Bikeability**

Your child will take part in Bikeability the week commencing **15<sup>th</sup> July**. Bikeability cycle training equips children with vital life skills. Pupils not only learn to cycle, they gain independence, social skills and a sense of wellbeing. After Bikeability, children are better at responding to risk and report increased confidence. As a result, more children cycle to school, which in turn, improves mental health and wellbeing. Bikeability instructors will come to school to deliver the training. A consent form will follow with more details. All children will need to bring a roadworthy cycle.

A roadworthy cycle has:

- Inflated tyres, as hard as an apple
- Two working brakes
- A well-oiled chain
- A saddle and handlebars fixed on tight

If your child does not own a cycle and you are unable to borrow one, please do let us know straight away.

### **End of Year Arrangements**

The annual Year 6 leavers' service, at Chichester Cathedral is on **26<sup>th</sup> June** at 10:30.
