What a year it has been at Fishbourne Church of England Primary School! We are so proud of all our children, staff and families who make up our learning community and always amazed at what we can achieve when we are all pulling together. There is so much to celebrate about our school and this newsletter is dedicated to doing just that. Here's a roundup of some of our highlights of this academic year!

Our whole school learning experiences have continued to be a very special time at Fishbourne. Children often talk about the impact these experiences have on them as learners and they are talked about so fondly. Staff also appreciate the opportunity to work collaboratively and plan together and benefit from professional development in other areas of the curriculum. On our website, there is a synopsis of each of these events going right back to our first one, A Small Miracle, for those of you whose children were with us at Christmas 2015! We love learning through experiences at Fishbourne Primary, this is a key part of what makes us unique and special as a school. This year we have enjoyed four whole school learning experiences:

THE LEARNING EXPERIENCE

***Where in the world?** A geography based learning experience which gave us the chance to jet off to some exotic locations around the world and see them from different perspectives. These perspectives challenged our views and encouraged us to think deeply about the world around us.

***Choose Respect** was a PSHCE based learning experience and gave us the opportunity to talk about bullying. We challenged the children to debate what should happen if someone is being bullied in school and the children were in almost total agreement that a bully should be both helped and punished. As a result of this experience, the children collaborated to write our anti-bullying booklet for children which can be found on our school website.

***Chicken Clicking** was our first one day learning experience and coincided with National Safer Internet Day. It provided an opportunity to celebrate how amazing the internet is while also raise awareness of some of the dangers. During the day, the children wrote a pledge about keeping themselves safe. These are on display in the ICT suite as a daily reminder of our commitment to staying safe online.

***Review!** Our final whole school learning experience of the year was a writing based one and involved the children learning to become theatre critics. Every child visited the theatre and watched their production through a different set of eyes... coming back to write some insightful and powerful reviews!



We have already mapped out our whole school learning experiences for the coming academic year and these promise to be just as exciting

and irresistible for everyone involved. We will have three of these experiences dotted throughout the year and we have already started planning for them. The first of these is called **PERFORM** and will be taking place during the week beginning the 30th September. Details about this will be coming home to you during the first week back after the holidays and we look forward to sharing with you more about it!

We believe that positive relationships underpin everything we do in school and so we have spent more time this half term getting to know the children who will be coming into our classrooms in September. By knowing the children really well and understanding their starting points, we are able to personalise learning highly effectively to meet their needs. This half term, the children's new class teacher/s have spent the last part of every day with them! This time has been spent enjoying a class story and spending time in their new classrooms. As a result, these relationships are already being built up and formed. It has been lovely to see story-time taking place in every classroom each day and the children having this opportunity to get to know their class teacher.

The work we have been doing to develop teaching and learning in maths is well underway and will continue into next year. We are delighted to be working with the National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics (NCTEM) in the coming academic years through which Mrs Buchan and Mrs Harris will be involved in some fantastic professional development. The focus will be on developing deep and lasting understanding of mathematical procedures and concepts. We are really looking forward to being involved, informed and inspired by the NCTEM and will share more about our School Development Plan early in the autumn term. It makes such a tremendous difference when children can recall their times tables quickly and easily.
