Children's learning is personalised to offer the support and challenge they need at the right times to ensure that they thrive.

The curriculum at Fishbourne is unique. It has been designed by the teaching team at Fishbourne to meet the needs of each cohort of children. At its heart there is a commitment to developing a set of core learning behaviours that our children will need for a lifetime of learning. By the time the children come to the end of their time with us, we will have nurtured them to become courageous, determined, positive, reflective and collaborative learners. They will be ready for their next adventure and confident about tackling the challenges that lie ahead.












Learning through experiences:

We believe that children learn best when they are excited by their learning and we do so much more than simply cover the National Curriculum. Our unique approach to the curriculum allows us to personalise learning to suit the needs of each of the children in our school by providing inspirational and challenging learning experiences.

Each learning experience is rooted in just one or two areas of the curriculum, allowing children time to explore and develop key knowledge and skills in these areas. An exciting and engaging **Hook** into learning makes the experience simply irresistible and the children know from the outset exactly what they are setting out to achieve in the form of an **End Goal**. The **steps of learning** are personalised using a **baseline** that takes place before the learning experience begins, taking into account the starting point of each child to achieve the highest possible quality outcome.



We recognise that the optimum approach to learning requires:

*Knowledge of the child -

We believe positive relationships with both children and families are at the heart of successful learning. Knowing the children well, knowing their starting points and barriers to learning help teaching staff to personalise learning to meet the children's needs. A secure knowledge of the children allows us to build on prior learning and experience.

*Knowledge of pedagogy -

We believe that as teachers we need to have a good understanding of the best approaches to use to support children's learning. Our approach is centred on the individual child; experience based learning; the child as an apprentice; scaffolding learning through carefully crafted steps; and creating irresistible learning opportunities.

*Knowledge of curriculum -

We know that we must ensure that our subject knowledge as teachers in all areas of the curriculum is secure. As a staff team we support one another with the development of this knowledge and provide high quality CPD to ensure that all staff have the subject knowledge they need to deliver the curriculum

*Motivation -

We strive to ensure that our children are excited, inspired and engaged in their learning.

*Learning opportunities -

We look for ongoing opportunities to inspire our children through real life learning. Our curriculum evolves to meet the needs of each new cohort and the children's interests and needs are placed at the heart of the decision making.

*Feedback -

Ongoing feedback to learners as part of a sequence of teaching and learning is essential and can take a variety of forms (see our assessment policy available on the website)
