A very warm welcome back to all our families this autumn term! It has been just wonderful to see the children arriving each day dressed smartly in their uniforms and full of chatter. Koalas class (Year 4) started their new year with a learning experience called 'Oh the Places You'll Go', focused around overcoming difficulties and being determined to make a difference. The hook was a day of games and activities based on solving problems and friendship activities. The end goal was linked to the book of the same title by Dr Seuss. The Koalas made a balloon of advice for making the world a better place for themselves, friends and others. These are displayed on our boards in the classroom.

Panthers Class (Year 5) have started their year by enjoying two very full days at Christian Youth Enterprises. They had a WONDERFUL time and returned with many tales to tell about their adventures! We love visiting CYE because the children's memories of their experiences last a life time! The Panthers used this opportunity to explore their comfort, stretch and panic zones, returning to document these in their recounts! Penguins Class (Year 3) were hooked into the Awesome Egyptians learning experience by learning to mummify oranges! They will be using all they have learnt during this experience to write their own Egyptian fairy tales enhanced with new vocabulary and historical knowledge.

Hippo Class (Year 1) have got stuck into 'Pass it on' which is one of our Patron of Reading, Sophy Henn's, brilliant books:

When you see something terrific, smile a smile and pass it on! The little girl in this bright, happy book embraces the simple act of passing on smiles, laughs, chuckles and whoops to others. A heartwarming and simple message about the power of positivity, this is a lovely book, reassuring that even in lonely times a smile can always help.

Elephants (Year 2) have used the story of Elmer as the inspiration for the children to get to know Miss Axelsen and her them! They have been hard at work creating their own Elmer's and writing 'getting to know you' guides to themselves! It's been lovely to see how quickly the elephants have settled with their new teacher and see them settling back into school life. Well done Elephants!



Tigers (Year 6) new learning experience 'Covid Chronicles' has been inspired by the street art that has popped up in response to the pandemic. They also looked at Covid inspired street art from around the world and listened to a Covid Chronicle from Radio 4's Today Programme.






We are really looking forward to our next whole school learning experience which is coming up in the two weeks before half term, Journey. This experience is inspired by a wordless picture book of the same name!
