


Dear Parents,

Our children have settled back well, we have built a clear picture of where they are in their learning and are planning for their next steps. We have spent time re-connecting with them and refining our curriculum to ensure that it meets them at their personal point of learning. As a result of this, some of our children have been identified as needing additional support to get them back on track and we will be discussing this with you in our Learning Review Meetings after half term. Working effectively in partnership with you is the key to supporting children to learn well and we look forward to sharing with you ways in which you will be able to support your children at home too.

As a learning community, we continue to strive towards being the best we can be and this issue of the newsletter focuses largely on our School Development Plan so that you know what our priorities are:



The most important priority in September was to ensure that the children came back to school and settled quickly and happily into daily routines. We have 3 R's that form our 'umbrella' and feed into all other areas of the School Development Plan: Re-connect, Re-group and Refine. The children's wellbeing and safety is held at the heart of our approach to learning at Fishbourne. We have quickly established the children's re-connection points and are already personalising their learning to meet their needs.



Priority 1: Maths- To explore and prepare a robust mathematical pedagogy rooted in the principles of mastery. We continue to focus on improving maths teaching and learning within school. This year Mrs Buchan and Mrs Harris will continue their work with the NCETM (National Centre for Excellence in the Teaching of Mathematics). They will be working alongside other schools to develop

and embed the mastery techniques explored last year. Number Fluency continues to be a key focus- practising number bonds and times tables and noticing patterns in numbers is something you could support the children with at home. In addition, we encourage the children to be able to talk about their maths (using correct mathematical vocabulary) and explain what they are doing and why it works. *Please do encourage your child to talk to you about what they are learning - the more opportunities they have to talk about their maths the better!* Priority 2: Curriculum development- To move into the 'delivery' phase of the Fishbourne 2020 curriculum maps, balancing skills and knowledge within our learning experience approach and personalising learning highly effectively to meet the needs of all learners. At Fishbourne, we share a collective belief that 'Education should be about broadening minds, enriching communities and advancing civilisations. Ultimately it is about leaving the world a better place than we found it.' Last year, we worked incredibly hard on developing our curriculum: our aim being to ensure that key knowledge and skills were developed progressively throughout our school. Working with a range of experts beyond our school gates and our local secondary schools we have crafted a curriculum that we feel exceptionally proud of. Our curriculum sets out to define what we want our artists, historians, scientists, geographers, musicians, citizens etc. to be able to do by the time they leave Fishbourne Primary - this forms our 'ultimate end goal'. Having established this, we then planned for how the knowledge, skills and vocabulary would be developed while identifying opportunities the children could have to use this growing understanding to make the world a better place to be. As a learning community, we are clear that we do not want the children to miss out on any of the non-core curriculum in a bid to 'catch-up' - instead we will use the non-core as a vehicle through which to teach the core. Priority 3: Behaviour: To explore, prepare and deliver a Behaviour Policy that reflects the vision and values of Fishbourne CE Primary School.

The children at Fishbourne Primary behave exceptionally well most of the time! As an adult learning community, we have set out to learn more about theories of behaviour in order to support more challenging behaviours when they arise in


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school. Every member of our staff team completed either Level 1, 2 or 3 training in Managing Challenging Behaviour and in the coming weeks we will be reflecting on this learning together with the support of Releasing Potential before reviewing and refining our behaviour policy with a team of our own Behaviour Champions. Our approach will have an important emphasis on the uniqueness of the individual, in line with our school vision and with our Christian values held at the heart of it. We look forward to sharing more of this work with you as it develops in the spring and summer terms.

Priority 4: Writing: To deliver well sequenced steps of writing development within learning experiences.

We use Learning Experiences at Fishbourne Primary as a vehicle through which to teach writing and reading. We recognise the importance of modelling writing to our young authors, so that our children grow into
