

Dear Parents

There is only one you in this great big world... make it a better place.

The vision for the children who come to Fishbourne Church of England Primary School is weaved through every fibre of school life. We believe that ultimately the learning we do should enable us to leave the world in a better place than we found it. Our curriculum is designed around this vision and our children are given the opportunity to use what they have learned to do just this.

Inspired by their learning experience, Swimming In It, where they had been learning about the impact that plastic pollution has on our oceans, Hippo class decided they wanted to do something to make their own village community a better place to be! They took themselves off to Fishbourne Playing Fields where they picked litter for an hour using some wonderful resources provided by Chichester District Council. Kevin Carter then talked them through how they could sort their litter to ensure that everything that could be was sent off for recycling.

Meanwhile, our Penguin class had been learning about planting, growing and the impact on our environment. They were hooked into their learning through a workshop provided by Tuppenny Barn. The children decided to make the world a better place to be by gifting seeds to our neighbours that would attract bees to their gardens. In the envelopes they included a letter with an explanation about why planting the seeds was so important and instructions on how to sow the seeds properly. They wanted to bring the joy of colour and shape to our local residents and tell them all that we have learned too! We received some lovely feedback from our neighbours, many of whom wrote to the children to thank them.

'Many thanks for your super presentation and seeds to help with our bee population. Without bees our civilisation would not survive so we must all do our bit to help. I learnt a lot about bees from your helpful and beautifully illustrated information—five eyes and not seeing red! When the rain finally stops I will certainly plant out the seeds. Well done for your efforts!'

At Fishbourne, we share a collective belief that:

Just before the half term break, we spent a day in school thinking deeply about how we behave and the impact our behaviours have on those around us. The focus on this comes at a time when we are in the process of reviewing our behaviour policy following some inspirational professional development from Releasing Potential. The children spent the day talking about the purpose of rules, positive and negative behaviours they see in school and then (the most challenging part of all!) arriving at three words that provide us with a summary or reminder of our rules. These three words will become a

really important part of the vocabulary we use in school to support self-regulation. We know that a list of rules isn't helpful and as Year 3 so powerfully reflected, many of our rules in school are 'silent rules' - ones we just know! The children's discussions and reflections were incredible and we really look forward to sharing with you the draft of our new behaviour policy which we are doing on Friday 16th July between 2.15 and 2.45pm (more details to follow!)

Governing in a time of Covid has been quite an introduction. I have been very impressed by the huge amounts of hard work that Naomi and all the staff at the school have managed to put in, and they have made such a success of this most challenging of years. I am proud to be associated



with the school. Governor visits to the school have remained on hold due to Covid but at our last 'virtual' Governing Board meeting

on the 6th May school policies on e-safety, the acceptable use of the internet, health & safety, and intimate care were all agreed. The school budget for 2021-22 was approved, which included allocation of funds for the purchase of new i-pads. Governors received an update from the Head Teacher on the school development plan and it's four current key priorities; the teaching of maths, delivering new curriculum maps, preparing a new school behaviour policy, and writing development within learning experiences. Governors also discussed how best to assess pupil progress and attainment. The next meeting, the last of this academic year, but hopefully the first in-person, will be on the 8th July.
