We have also welcomed this week our Army of Volunteers who are supporting children's reading across school and are now starting work in our classrooms. It was a privilege to meet with them last week and complete the final part of their



training. We have 24 volunteers made up of parents, grandparents, community members and a number of retired teachers. At this time of year, we like to update you with our plans for developing the school. At Fishbourne Primary, we recognise that change doesn't happen overnight! Underpinning our school development plan is an understanding that development is a living and breathing process, one that requires professional tinkering along the way! We are passionate about developing a strong learning and deep thinking culture within our school community at all levels and are relentlessly optimistic about our vision for all learners at Fishbourne Primary. All areas of proposed change are explored thoroughly - researched, evidence based and reflected upon.

Each stage of our development has sought to secure an 'optimum pedagogic approach' – meaning the best possible way to lead the learning taking place within our classrooms. In doing so, we recognise the importance of our:

- -knowledge of the child (our WHY!)
- -knowledge of pedagogy (our HOW!) -knowledge of subject/curriculum (our WHAT!)

and equally the role of:

- -feedback
- -motivation
- -opportunities

We believe that in order for change to be implemented well in our school, we must move through four key phases:

EXPLORE - PREPARE - DELIVER - SUSTAIN

This academic year we have four core priorities in the DELIVERY stage. These are:

*To deliver a robust mathematical pedagogy rooted in the principles of mastery consistently across the school.

*To deliver the non-core curriculum by designing end goals for learning experiences that give the children the opportunity to communicate and demonstrate their growing knowledge and skill in non-core areas of learning highly effectively

*To deliver our 'behaviour for learning and life policy' consistently throughout school, reflecting the vision and values of Fishbourne CE Primary

*To deliver well sequenced steps of writing development within the learning experiences, informed by AfL (assessment for learning) from the baseline.

While this development continues, the leadership team move into an 'EXPLORE' stage for future development of:

*reading – approaches to phonics, teaching early reading and comprehension skill progressions

*cognitive science – what research tells us about how children can remember more

*WELLBEING for all members of our school community

HOLIDAYS DURING TERM TIME

We <u>urge</u> families to avoid booking holidays during term time - not only will this disadvantage your own children but it will also have a negative impact on other children in your child's class. We absolutely understand that families have not been able to enjoy holidays away from home together over the last year BUT the impact of lost school time is very significant for children across the country and by adding to this pressure, we are not working together effectively as a school community to meet the needs of all our learners.





There are so many exciting plans being hatched behind the scenes for the children, the first of which is happening during the week beginning Monday 4th October when we will be welcoming THREE authors into school to inspire our children.

We are thrilled to be part of the Chichester Children's Bookfest (https://www.childrensbookfest.com/) and, as a result, we will be welcoming Rob Biddulph in to work with the children in Year 3 and 4. He will be

talking to the children about his BRAND NEW book which was published at the beginning of September called 'Peanut Jones and the Illustrated City'. We love Rob's work and have a huge number of his books in school—many of our children enjoyed Rob's draw-a-longs during lockdowns! Alex English, author of 'Sky Pirates' will be coming in to work with our children in Year 5 and 6, talking about her series of books.

All the children in Key Stage 2 will receive a FREE copy of their book thanks to the extremely generous funding from Children's Bookfest. We will be using these books as whole class texts (in fact most classes are already devouring their books), exploring the developing characters and plot and sharing our reflections. When these books come home at the end of the class read, you will see there is a bookplate stuck in the front with more information!





At the end of the week we will then be welcoming our very own Patron of Reading, the truly wonderful Sophy Henn, for her first school visit in almost two years. The last time we saw Sophy was when we took a group of children from Y5 and 6 up to London for the Laugh Out Loud Book Awards in March 2019. Sophy has kept in touch throughout this time, sending the children short films, parcels and even joining us live a couple of times for Golden Learner assemblies! We LOVE working with

Sophy and have gained so much from this link, watching her working on new projects (we will never forget her sharing with us her brand new idea for Pizazz when she was still exploring the concept and watching the idea grow and grow... it's now three books in to the series!). It will be wonderful to see Sophy in school and we really look forward to her visits returning each term! Sophy's visit will particularly focus on our children in

Reception, Y1 and Y2 although we know everyone will be thrilled to see her!





Hello. I'm Jenny Blamire and I'm currently in my second term as a foundation governor. That means I'm one of two governors appointed by Fishbourne Parish Church to represent them on your governing body. It's a great privilege to be involved with the school and especially to contribute to the Christian ethos and help build strong links with St Peter and St Mary's Church in the village. I attend the special school assemblies at Christmas and Faster, Harvest and Remembrance Day. Twice a term, when Covid allows, I bring a group from the parish, called the Storytellers and we act out a Bible story for the children in assembly time.
